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


Department of Health accepting applications

- Application period from February 20 March 20
- Phased in implementation
 - 12 grow/processing licenses
 - 27 dispensary licenses
 - Six Regions
- Application forms and Instructions on DOH Website
- 1000 point scoring rubric to evaluate criteria set forth in 35 Pa.C.S.A. 10231.603(a)
- Licenses awarded late June, 2017
- Second round of licenses to be available at later date



Pennsylvania Department of Health Medical Marijuana Regions



Region 5 - Southwest

5 dispensary permits 2 grower/processor permits

Region 3 - Southcentral

4 dispensary permits 2 grower/processor permits

Region 1 - Southeast

10 dispensary permits 2 grower/processor permits



Transferability/Relocation

- •35 Pa.C.S.A. §10231.603(b) A license awarded by the DOH is NOT transferrable
- •35 Pa.C.S.A. §10231.609 "The department may approve an application from a medical marijuana organization to relocate within this Commonwealth or to add or delete activities or facilities."
- •Any change in circumstances after submitting application to be brought to DOH attn during review period

Safe Harbor for Adult patients?

- Children with a qualifying condition may apply for a letter granting them legal protection
- May possess and consume "medical cannabis products" sourced from a legal medical cannabis state
- Child may only possess a medical cannabis product as defined by Act.
- Does not apply to adults
- Statewide decriminalization priority to protect adult patients
 - Bipartisan support but some want mandatory \$500 fines and drug treatment for repeat offenders
 - Piecemeal approach of City by City decrim leaves patients at risk



Qualifying Conditions

- HIV/AIDS, Cancer, ALS, PTSD, Autism, Glaucoma, Chronic neuropathic pain, Parkinson's, MS, Epilepsy, Severe seizure disorder, IBS, Crohn's, Neuropathies, Sickle Cell Anemia, Huntington's Disease
- Growers/Processors will be responsible for determining what products to produce for patients
- Estimated patient population of up to 200,000 215,000
- Conditions may be added by the DOH beginning in May, 2018



Medical Cannabis Products

- Oil, Pill, Tincture, Topical, Liquid and "a form medically appropriate for vaporization or nebulization excluding dry leaf form"
- Dry leaf may be added as a medicinal cannabis product in May, 2018
- No strain restrictions or THC caps (at present)
- Grower/processor to determine what to grow and produce
- No limits on oil or concentrated forms
- Patients will ultimately guide the market



Training requirements

- 2 hour training course for all employees
- Principles must complete training prior to opening for business
 - Must address criminal diversion, handling and storage of medical marijuana products, inventory tracking
- Physicians must complete 4 hour training course to be developed by the DOH
 - Physician registry to be maintained by DOH
- Physician participation critical to success of program



Advisory Board Duties

- Advisory Board to be created
- Patient representative selected
- Will be responsible for evaluating requests to add qualifying conditions, medical marijuana products (such as dry leaf)
- Will approve temporary regulations
- Duties set forth at 35 Pa.C.S.A. 10231.1201



Issues for Employers

- •An employer cannot discriminate or retaliate solely because of medical marijuana use
- Employer NOT required to permit use on premises
- May discipline patient if patient intoxicated or if work performance drops
- •No private cause of action in Act 16
- Nothing compels employer to violate federal law



Zoning Requirements

- •A grower/processor shall meet the same municipal zoning and land use requirements as other manufacturing, processing and production facilities that are located in the same zoning district.
- •A dispensary shall meet the same municipal zoning and land use requirements as other commercial facilities that are located in the same zoning district.
